With a limited budget and limited resources, Copper Cannon was fortunate to have Habitat for Humanity come to the rescue. A wonderful crew of volunteers spent six weeks building a new bathhouse in the boy's cabin area.

The bathhouse is a Bill Howe design with two toilets and two outdoor showers. It includes a bank of sinks to make hand washing and teeth brushes a dream. Bill designed the building with a combination of a metal roof and clear plastic panels allowing only natural light and requiring no electricity.



Needless to say, the boys and staff fell in love with the new structure. The boys enjoy not having to walk down in to main camp to use the toilet or brush their teeth. It will also allow Copper Cannon to increase the number of youth we serve during the summer.
